Our readings call us to roll up our sleeves and persevere through the remainder of Lent by committing to a more faithful life with Christ.

In today's Gospel, Jesus purifies the temple area because it is being misused as a marketplace. He becomes angry at their lack of reverence for God. He spills the coins of the money changers and overturns tables, saying, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace."

Jesus witnessed the way people mistreated the temple — the place to worship God and God alone. He drives out evil and works to purify all that is sinful in that place. Signatures to get on the ballot sheet

If you are qualified to vote in Marion County, you can help anyone running for public office by signing their list out in the portico.

Candidates running for office have to pay \$12,000 or get 2,700 signatures to be on the ballot sheet. You are not voting for that person.

We allow all candidates running for public office to collect signatures outside the church regardless of what office or position they are running for.

We are not in anyway recommending the person. We are just helping them run for public office. You have to do your own research to decide who you are voting for.

We allow only one candidate outside church on any one weekend.

Novena of Grace


