Our readings today teach us what it means to bear fruit as disciples of Christ. We hear in each of our readings that it is from the Lord that good effects will be produced in our lives.

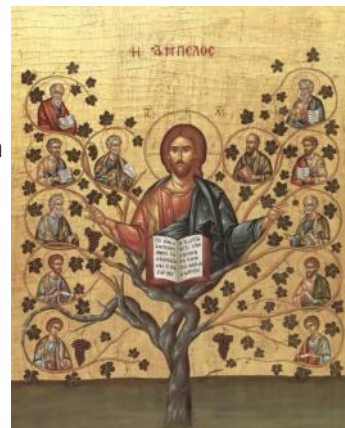
In our first reading, we hear about disciples that were preaching the Good News and defending the faith. The work they were doing was "with the consolation of the Holy Spirit." It was not their work alone, but the work of God.

We must ask ourselves, 'how is God bearing fruit in my life?' and 'have I invited the Holy Spirit to work in me?' The more we try to produce good effects in our lives, the more we will become disappointed if all we are relying on is our own efforts. It is only by inviting the Holy Spirit into our everyday moments that we will see goodness poured out.

Jesus clearly tells us how to do this in our Gospel. He says, "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit." We can remain in Christ by staying faithful to His commandments and frequently receiving the sacraments. And our day to day moments should be a reflection of those commitments.

That could mean opening our day with a prayer of thanksgiving, smiling at those we see on the street, asking God for help as we begin our workday, praising God in moments of trial, taking time to listen to our spouse after a long day. To remain in Christ means, in all that we do, we do it with the Lord.

When we live a life like that — as a branch never separated from its vine — God will produce bountiful fruit in our lives.

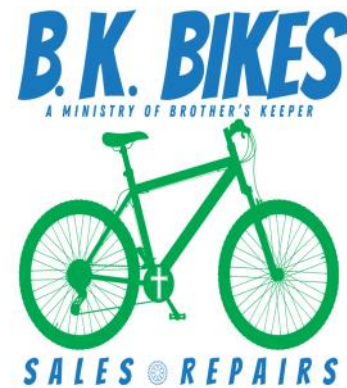

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

Jesus offers a quintessential stewardship statement in today's Gospel reading: "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." Jesus Christ offers us the fullness of eternal life. Do our lives reveal that this is what we want? Do we believe that by hearing the Word of the Lord and responding we not only produce "good fruit," but abide in the very life of God?

THE ELIJAH CUP-TRAVELING CHALICE

One of the great needs of the Church is the ongoing need for prayer for vocations to the priesthood, sisterhood and brotherhood. In the US, overall, the Church is doing relatively well with the number of men entering the seminary. We need to do even better. We get many foreign vocations. That is most helpful. Of course the long range goal would be not only to produce enough vocations for the Catholic Church in the US but also to be able to send out missionaries to countries who have a shortage.

Most parishes now have a vocations committee. One of the big efforts of our parish vocations committee to raise awareness for religious vocations is the use of the traveling Chalice or Elijah Cup. At the English Mass, one family or person at the end of Mass receives the Elijah Cup and takes it home and that family prays especially for vocations at their family prayer time. They then bring it back the following weekend. Children love to bring the Elijah Cup home. Generally there is a race to the altar to see who gets the cup. While all that is nice, the result is most of the parishioners are excluded from taking the cup home.

If you wish to take the cup home and commit to praying especially for vocations you do not have to run to the altar. Just raise your hand and we will bring the Chalice/Elijah Cup to you.

In your prayer for vocations include the following:

- Pray for priests, sisters, brothers and seminarians who have already accepted God's call to the religious life.
- Pray that those who are being called by God will have the faith, courage and commitment to respond to God's call.
- Pray for families, especially parents, that they will encourage vocations to the religious life in their own family.
- Pray for priests, brothers and sisters who have misused their privileged positions. Pray for their conversion and their forgiveness.
- Pray for the success, worldwide of the mission Jesus entrusted to His Church.
