



PEACE & SOCIAL JUSTICE

The majority of small family farmers in Africa, Asia, Palestine, and South America producing coffee, tea, cocoa, and olive oil are living in poverty. They don't have the money or the means necessary to transport their crop to their local market. They must rely on local middlemen to buy their crops from them. Forced to sell at rock bottom prices with no means of income, they get stuck in a cycle of dependency that becomes impossible to break.
