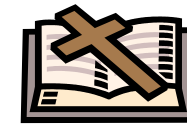

## Stewardship Saint for June—Maria Guadalupe Garcia Zavala

Maria Guadalupe Garcia Zavala was born in 1878 in Zapopan, Jalisco, Mexico. As a child she made frequent visits to the Basilica of Our Lady of Zapopan, located next to her father's religious goods shop. Her acquaintances said Maria treated everyone with equal respect and kindness.

At age 23, Maria was engaged to be married, but broke it off because of a growing sense that the Lord was calling her to life in religious community and of service to the sick and the poor. When she confided this change of heart to her spiritual director, he revealed his own desire to establish a religious community to work with those who were hospitalized. He invited Maria to join him.

The new congregation, which officially began in 1901, was known as the "Handmaids of St. Margaret Mary (Alacoque) and the Poor." Maria worked as a nurse in the hospital. Compassion and care for the physical and spiritual well-being of the sick were the primary concerns. Maria worked tirelessly.

Sister Maria was soon named head of the quickly-growing community of sisters. She taught the community, mostly by her example, the importance of living the Gospel's spirit of poverty. This included living a life of humility and exhibiting joy and a loving demeanor each day to each person they encountered.

At times, Mother Maria and others in the community would take to the streets begging in order to collect money for the hospital. The sisters also worked in parishes to assist the priests and to serve as catechists.

From 1911 until 1936, the Catholic church in Mexico underwent severe persecution. Mother Maria put her own life at risk to help the clergy of Guadalajara, and even the archbishop, go into hiding in the community's hospital. The humble and generous treatment she extended even to their persecutors when they needed food or medical care did not go unnoticed. It was not long before they, too, began defending the hospital run by the sisters.

During her lifetime, 11 foundations were established in Mexico. Today, the religious community has 22 foundations and is active in Mexico, Peru, Iceland, Greece and Italy.

Mother Maria died on June 24, 1963, at the age of 85. Her feast day is June 24.



## Vacation Bible School

Wednesday, June 13, marked the 60th anniversary of the death of Servant of God Nicola d'Onofrio who was a patron of this year's VBS.

During VBS we sang an ancient hymn: Come Lord Jesus, Maranatha! *Maranatha* is often translated as "Come, Lord" or "Our Lord, come." Its roots can be traced to the Aramaic words *maran*, meaning "Lord," and *atha*, meaning "come." Saint Paul used this Aramaic term to say, "Come, Lord." Using the word *maranatha* in worship and prayer expresses a longing for Jesus Christ's return. *Maranatha* embodies Christians' hope and faith that Jesus will someday return to fulfill his promises and establish the Kingdom of God.

## Angels' Prayer for our VBS students during the month of June

This year we are inviting the whole parish community to support the three Vacation Bible Schools that will be held in June at the parish, La Guadalupana Mission and Christ the King. La Guadalupana will meet on each Friday afternoon in June and Christ the King will meet in the afternoons of June 24-30. We also include the children who will be taught by members of our Uganda mission team alongside local catechists in the latter half of the month of June.
