Our readings today remind us to live our lives in total surrender to God's care.

The Gospel recounts when Jesus instructs His twelve apostles to begin their missionary work two by two. He encouraged them to take very little — a walking stick and sandals.

If you can recall a time you packed for a trip, or even left the house for a day's travel, you might remember making a list or packing days in advance. We tend to pack so we know we will be comfortable.

If we extend this concept of "comfort" into other areas of our lives, we will most likely find a few instances where we ensure life is comfortable. It could be buying extra food at the grocery store, making sure we have the most updated technology, or even feeling safe in our bank accounts.

It is not bad to have extra food in the pantry or a new phone. And it isn't bad to save money. These things can be good when used properly.

But what if we are looking to these things for comfort, security or even happiness?

Imagine if Jesus approached you and said, "Go out and do my work, but you can only bring a walking stick and shoes." Would you be willing to surrender all the rest?

A key component of living out our call as Christian stewards is total surrender. It is trusting in God during our best moments and our hardest. It is looking to Him for security, comfort and happiness.

Reflect on the ways you might be looking for comfort in the things of this world. Tangibly find a way to become independent from that "thing" so that you can become more dependent on God.

Be Good Stewards of Your Family This Summer

July is the heart of summer, and summer is an exciting and challenging time for stewardship of the family.

Everything turns a little upside down for the family in summer. Kids out of school, grandparents visiting, teens with a first job, road trips and those big family reunions: Sometimes it seems summer dashes by in a flurry of wet bathing suits and backyard barbecues. How does the Christian steward make summer a special time for "the domestic church" of family?

Relax!...No, really!...Relax!...Slow down! The world often spins around us and we are caught up in work, social media, activity. Gift yourself and your family with time this summer. Be truly present. On one occasion, when Pope Francis addressed a homily to families, one word he used often was "simplicity." Make time for family meals, but make them simple and nutritious. "We need simplicity to pray as a family," the Holy Father said. Let each family member take a turn praying a simple grace at family meals. Linger over good food and good conversation. Make family your focus. Listen to your children. Take time for a night out with your spouse. Make a commitment to fun and presence.

The Holy Father also asked families, "How do we keep our faith as a family?" We don't keep it for ourselves, he said, "as a personal treasure like a bank account." No, we share it. We witness it. How can we witness faith during the summer months? "Christian families are missionary families," Pope Francis said. Summer is a good time to plan a field trip to a shelter or a food bank. Call ahead and ask what you can bring and how your family can help. Many agencies plan summer picnics and presentations by refugees during the season. Let your kids experience this diversity. Attend a vacation bible school or help with one. Invite a priest from your parish, or perhaps a lonely neighbor, to dinner. Spread your family joy.

The summer readers in your family might benefit from finding Catholic periodicals or books on heroes of our faith. Visit new parishes during the summer. If you are on a road trip, never miss Sunday Mass and take advantage of a side trip to a shrine or an historic Catholic church. Most of all, relax and enjoy. Pope Francis says, "The family which experiences the joy of faith communicates it naturally."

National Eucharistic Revival

Pilgrims from around the United States are gathering this week to attend the National Eucharistic Congress which begins on Wednesday through next Sunday, July 21. Some 50,000 people are expected to take part. Throughout the country, Catholic parishes will join the Congress in spirit to celebrate the greatest gift we have from Jesus, his continued presence among us.

When describing the Eucharist, the words "real presence," relay the church's unwavering faith in the mystery at the heart of this special gift from God. The Eucharist is not a symbol, it is not a reminder of an absent presence as some would have us think. Such a misunderstanding is a complete aberration. The novelist Flannery O'Connor got it right when she said: "If it's just a symbol then to hell with it!" At every Eucharist through God's grace, we are allowed to reach beyond the confines of time to be present before the once and forever sacrifice of Christ. The one Jesus Christ is equally present to us and we to Him in the Eucharist in Ocala as he is in all Eucharistic celebrations be they in Jerusalem, Rome or Indianapolis.

Six months have passed since the mission of the Dominican Friars, which celebrated the healing power of the Eucharist, came to Blessed Trinity. The mission brought us together to acknowledge the healing Eucharistic presence of Jesus among us. On the final night the church was filled to overflowing, parishioners and non-parishioners alike approached the altar with reverence and faith. Now we pray for all those who travel to Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Congress, knowing that wherever we and they are, we share in the one faith, worship the one Lord and are united by the one baptism which unites us as one Eucharist, now and always.
