The servant and the little boy in our readings today are excellent examples for us as Christian stewards. The servant gave the very best of what he had, and the boy gave all that he had, then God did the rest.

A key component of living as a good steward is constantly evaluating our lives, particularly our relationship with God to ensure we are not just scraping by but rather giving God our entire lives.

We should ask ourselves — 'how am I giving God my time, using my talents, and sharing my treasures?'

We are called to give God adequate time each day. If we don't plan for this time, likely, He won't get any. We need to find what works best for us so that God can become a more significant part of our daily lives. We are also called to put our gifts and talents to good use too. The servant and the boy teach us that it is not up to us to decide how our gifts will affect others. God will do that. All we need to do is to give it well.

Lastly, the servant reminds us that we are called to give the first fruits of our treasures. It is easy to give something; it is difficult to give the finest gift. Giving our best requires us to reevaluate our priorities in life.

When we strive to live out our call as Christian stewards by entrusting all that we have been given to the One who graciously gave us these gifts, we will be blessed beyond measure. As we begin a new week, let us spend some time evaluating our relationship with God by asking, 'what is my very best, and am I giving it to God?'





# **Something To Celebrate**

Last week 50,000 people made the journey to Indianapolis for the Eucharistic Congress whilst millions more were part of Eucharistic celebrations across the country in churches and chapels in groups small and large. What is remarkable is that in each gathering the focal point is always the same: it is found in the moment Jesus turned to His disciples and commanded them to celebrate the Last Supper in memory of Him. Spiritually, the Last Supper is the most visited event in history bar none; an invisible golden chain transcends historical time so that we too hear the same command, follow the same instructions from our Lord as gather around the priest at the altar to proclaim His death and resurrection.

The disciples present at the Last Supper did not understand what was about to happen. After the resurrection they did. In faith we believe that the command they received was given for all Christians and for all time. We recall the admonition of Jesus to Thomas: "You believe because you can see Thomas, blessed are those who do not see yet believe!" (John 20:29). Faith is the most demanding call made upon us in life but as we gather for the Eucharist this weekend, we know it makes all the difference. No one was more honest in the Gospels than the father who sought Jesus' help for his child who was dying. When asked by Jesus if he had faith, his response, "Lord I believe, help my unbelief!" cam deep from the heart. Two thousand years later his answer speaks for so many of us. As we place ourselves in the presence of Jesus at church this weekend, we do so seeking greater faith, deeper love, and enduring hope. And we know the one person who can hear these heartfelt prayers is here before us in the elements of bread and wine, in the word proclaimed and the people gathered around us: only through his Eucharistic sacrifice we are able to say there is One Lord, One Faith and One baptism (Ephesians 4:5-6).

#### Saint Martha—One of Jesus' Closest Friends

Just before Jesus' final entry into Jerusalem, his close friends, Martha, her sister, Mary, and brother, Lazarus, entertained him at their home in Bethany. Martha "served," while Mary anointed his feet. It is in the simple statement, "Martha served," that we recognize Martha for her witness to stewardship. She isn't a prolific evangelist, she doesn't work miracles. She simply serves Jesus.

Jesus may have been a frequent visitor to Martha's home and perhaps this is one of the reasons the Gospel of John reveals to us that "Jesus loved Martha, and her sister Mary, and Lazarus" (11:5). This unique statement in the Gospel informs us of the special relationship Jesus had with Martha and her siblings. And, as another one of Jesus' visits to Martha's home affirms, Martha continues to be concerned that Jesus be served. Like any good steward, hospitality was very important to Martha (Luke 10:38-42).

What is most revealing about Martha is on the occasion of the death of Lazarus (John 11:1-44). She takes an active role, going out to meet Jesus to let him know what happened to her brother while Mary stays at home. Jesus assures her that Lazarus will be raised from dead.

With courage and conviction, Martha confesses her deep faith in Jesus Christ: "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." And then Jesus said to her: "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." When he asked Martha if she believed this, she replied: "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world" (John 11:24-27).

The feast of Saint Martha, a witness to service who confessed her faith in Jesus, is July 29. She is the patron saint of homemakers, cooks, domestic workers, waiters and waitresses, and hotel employees.
