We must keep this in perspective as we journey on our path as Christian stewards. We do not live for this life, but for the next.

He has given us time every day, countless talents, and numerous treasures. Are we using them for His glory?

This week when we witness other people in our lives using the gifts God has given to them, instead of becoming jealous or critical, say a prayer of thanksgiving and take time to reflect on what God has gifted you and how you can offer it to Him for His glory.

#### Why join the music ministry?

In Father Pat's homily for the 18<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary time, he talked about eight hungers that should be satisfied to be properly nourished as human beings and children of God. Being part of the Music Ministry can feed many of those hungers:

- The hunger for a feeling of importance All of our musicians are important to one another and to the parish. We work together to become good song leaders and make beautiful music for worship.
- The hunger for acceptance We love new musicians. Becoming part of the music ministry brings with it a group of people that will welcome you into their fold.
- 3) The hunger for relationships The music minsters develop a great fellowship. We enjoy our time together at rehearsals and during mass, and celebrate with each other each spring as our formal music ministry year comes to a close.
- 4) The hunger for motivation Our music ministry motivates us. It gives us a purpose each Wednesday at rehearsal and each Sunday at mass. We all learn differently, and when one of us is having a difficult time learning our music we help each other.
- 5) The hunger for faith We grow closer to our faith through our music. Listen to the words of our songs and hymns. They teach us a lot about the meaning of our faith and bring us closer to Jesus.
- 6) We hunger for hope Music can change lives. It has been proven that music can affect our mood and it's hard to feel "down" when you're singing an energetic song. Participating in the music ministry can make a difficult day better,
- 7) We hunger for love The music ministers are a loving group. We help each other, both as part of the ministry and in our personal lives.
- 8) We hunger for eternal life, in other words, we hunger for God – Being part of the music ministry helps us to more fully participate in the mass. We reflect, individually and as a group, on how the words of the songs relate to the readings for the day and their deeper meaning, bringing us closer to God.
