



Our readings today offer us a message of hope — God is with us and wants to heal us. May this message come ablaze in our hearts so that we might live with unwavering faith.

The Gospel presents us with the story of the profound physical healing of a deaf man with a speech impediment. People brought him to Jesus and begged for his healing. Jesus took the man off by himself, touched his ears and his tongue, then proclaimed, "Be opened!" Immediately he was healed.

This story in our Gospel overwhelms us with comfort and peace because we have a compassionate God who sees our physical needs. Yet if we reflect further on this reading, we see that God uses this moment of physical healing as an opportunity to restore something much deeper — our souls.

Oftentimes we are blind and deaf to God in our lives. We miss countless opportunities to see God working in our day-to-day moments — through our loved ones, our community, or even a stranger. We miss the quiet voice of Jesus in our hearts telling us to choose Him instead of sin, respond in love instead of anger, or care for someone else in a moment instead of ourselves.

These are how we need to be spiritually healed. And the scriptures remind us that God is with us and wants to heal us.

This week let us seek God to heal our souls and transform our hearts. Let us pray that our eyes and our ears might "be open" to His workings, words, and promptings in our lives.

Father Pat's 1st Sacrament Meeting


Fr. Pat's 1st Sacrament meeting will be **THIS** Sunday, September 8th at 9:55am in the gym.

Baby Bottle Boomerang

During the weekend of **September 21/22**, baby bottles will be available after each Mass. All donations will benefit **Alpha Center for Women**, an Ocala pregnancy resource center that offers life-affirming alternatives to abortion, material support during and after pregnancy, post-abortion recovery and a mentoring program for parents in need. From 2006 to present, the generous parishioners of Blessed Trinity have contributed over \$128,300! Last year we ministered to 162 new clients providing pregnancy tests and meeting material needs through our Bridges program. Over 1,500 client visits took place and we assisted our moms and dads with nearly 22,500 closet items (diapers, wipes, clothing, food, and furniture, as well as utility assistance, gas and grocery gift cards). In addition, your support has allowed us to continue our sponsorship of two Uganda students and the Uganda Orphanage.

Thank you for your partnership with Alpha Center for Women. It is truly a ministry serving the poor in our community and helping them find a way to say "YES" to life.



URGENT NEED FOR UGANDA COLLEGE STUDENTS WHO WILL NEED TO SUSPEND THEIR COLLEGE EDUCATION DUE TO LACK OF SUPPORT

Over the years, Blessed Trinity has supported many Uganda college students from charity donations. Unfortunately, this source of support will not have the financial means to continue their support of these students, at least for the coming year. There are many students who are in their last year or last semester who will have to drop out of college unless they can find alternative funding. The semester has already begun in Uganda; however, if funding can be obtained, they will still be able to attend this year.

There are 29 college students and 11 seminarians who need assistance in order to continue their education. The average amount needed per student is \$600. (this is half the total amount; students are required to fund the other half). If you are able to assist, payment can be made by check to Blessed Trinity (university support) or on-line. 
