

We have arrived at the powerful season of Advent, a season to prepare with awe and wonder for the Feast of the Incarnation of Jesus — born to us as Savior and Brother. It is a season to prepare for His return at the end of time. It is also a moment to remind ourselves that our individual judgment day is coming, too, when we will be called to give an account for all that God has given to us during our lifetimes. In other words, Advent is a steward's season!

Our readings for the first week of Advent waste no time in calling our urgent attention to these themes of reflection and preparation. They seem to shout, "Wake up! Get ready!" and offer us some practical advice as we enter into this season.

The Gospel, from Luke, warns, "Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and

drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life." How easy it is to lose focus on our Lord either by too much indulgence in our lives or by too much worry about our lives. During Advent, we Christian stewards must ask ourselves some hard questions. Am I staying faithful to my prayer life? Am I using my energy and skills to serve others? Am I overly concerned about material gain? Am I relying on my "stuff" or my investments as my source of comfort or security? Am I living for the moment or for the coming of the Lord?

Get ready Christian stewards! He's coming! Let us prepare with awe and wonder.

RE: Monday, December 9, 2024 - Immaculate Conception Holy day of Obligation

December 8, 2024, is the Second Sunday of Advent, so the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday, December 9, 2024. Previously, when the date was transferred the obligation was abrogated. However, this is no longer true.

From the USCCB:

"Earlier this year, Bishop Thomas J. Paprocki, Chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Canonical Affairs and Church Governance, wrote to the Holy See seeking clarification about the obligation to attend Mass when a holy day of obligation in Advent, Lent, or Easter falls on Sunday and the Solemnity is transferred to Monday. In a memo to the U.S. bishops dated Thursday, October 10, Bishop Paprocki communicated the Dicastery for Legislative Text's response: "the feast must be observed as a day of obligation on the day to which it is transferred."

In light of this new directive, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception Monday, December 9, 2024 is to be observed as a holy day of obligation.


"Prepare Now"

December is such a busy time of year, and a month that tempts us to lose sight of the profound spiritual importance of the Advent and Christmas seasons. The best way to stay focused on the coming of Jesus Christ is to be good stewards of his presence in our daily lives. Here are simple ways to exercise good stewardship of this sacred time of year.

- 1) Give God a very special gift this year: Let this gift be something personal that no one else needs to know about, and let it be a sacrifice. Perhaps your gift will be to commit to spending more time with God daily. Perhaps there is a habit you know you should give up. Why wait for a New Year's resolution? Start now.
- Celebrate the season of Advent: Light the Advent wreath candles each night before dinner. If you have children, let them offer their own prayers to the Christ child for whom we are waiting.
- 3) Set aside a special time to read the Christmas story in the Gospel of Saint Luke 1:5-56 through 2:1-20: consider reading this account with your family or friends and discussing it together.
- 4) Put a creche up in your home at the beginning of Advent: consider having one set that is "kid-proof" which your children are allowed to handle. Kids love to make the Nativity story their own, and they especially love the angels!
- 5) Plan a project to help someone this Christmas: identify someone with a genuine need, involve your whole family and see how happy you can make someone this Christmas.
- 6) Enjoy an eco-friendly Christmas: Christmas is a time when a large number of people enjoy excess and extravaganza, but the environmental cost can be quite dramatic. Arguably, a million miles of unrecyclable wrapping paper is thrown in the trash every year. Where possible, use recyclable gift wrap.
- 7) Attend Christmas Mass together with family or friends: December 25 falls on Wednesday this year so make sure you are present at the Table of the Lord. If you are alone this Christmas, invite a friend or a neighbor to join you.

NEWS FROM OUR SISTER PARISH, NALWEYO, UGANDA

By now, everyone will have received the Uganda edition of the Triangle, with articles from most of the Mission team members. Our plan is to publish a monthly update on the on-going needs/issues in Nalweyo and some of the sub-parishes. We sincerely want to thank all our sponsors who have contributed funds for books, and general school supplies for the schools in the sub-parishes - your generous donations are very much appreciated.

Currently there are 23 students who still do not have sponsors. Along with the Nalweyo students, there are 8 Seminarians who are in need of sponsors, and three high school seminarians.

The Mission has on-going needs that, as always, need the financial support of our very generous sponsors. As a brief update, there are three sub-parishes in need of new wells.

We need to evaluate the need for new dormitories and staff houses in some of the sub-parishes.

The Church at Nalweyo has become too small to accommodate the parishioners and students. Plans have been drawn up and the approximate cost is \$250.000.

In December of this year, six of the Senior Students from Trinity Catholic in Nalweyo will be traveling to Johannesburg to take part in a national debating competition. This team came in second in their Regional competition and we wish them luck when they compete on a national level.

Please feel free to contact Sr. Juliet if you have any questions about the Blessed Trinity Nalweyo mission, especially if you would like to sponsor a child, or one of the Seminarians.
