





Today is the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. For centuries we as Catholics celebrated this Feast on Jan. 6, but the decision was made a number of years ago (at least in the United States) to celebrate the Epiphany on the Sunday which falls between Jan. 2 and Jan. 8.

"Epiphany" means "manifestation." It is on this day that Jesus Christ, the Messiah, is revealed as the light of all nations. Officially Christmas is not over. In fact, the recommendation of the Church is that on this day those who display a crèche, a nativity or manger scene, should replace the shepherd and sheep with the Magi and their likely animals on which they traveled as well as their gifts. However, that is all secondary to the real meaning of this day.

At Christmas the Messiah Jesus was revealed to the shepherds, who were Jewish. But on this day the Lord is revealed to all nations and to the Gentiles (represented by the Magi). We are all familiar with the

star the Magi followed, but we need to understand all that is happening and what it means. This all represents the Light of Christ, a Light which today we honor and commemorate. We are called to be the Light of Christ right now to those around us and those with whom we come in contact. That way we can be the disciples Christ wants us to be.

The poet William Cullen Bryant captures the significance of the star the Magi followed very well when he wrote, "O Father, may that Holy Star, Grow every year more bright, And send its glorious beams afar, To fill the world with light."

HAPPY NEW YEAR

Every year billions of people celebrate a mother and the birth of her baby.

Children around the world point at the newborn child in the nativity scene and ask, "Who's that?" and parents and grandparents whisper, "That's Jesus, Our Lord and Savior."

Then the same children point to Mary and ask, "And who's that?" and they get the answer, "That's His mother, without her Christmas could not have happened."

We Catholics love our church. As in our families, we are born into the church at baptism. Like a mother, the church feeds us in the eucharist, forgives us in reconciliation, strengthens us in confirmation, consoles us with the anointing of the sick and gives us away in marriage or religious life.

In this family of faith we look to Mary as our spiritual mother—a mother who inspires, guides and protects us.

Mary never went to college, yet we call her "The seat of wisdom" - as she gave flesh to wisdom, to the word, to the eternal son of God.

Her proclamation, "Be it done to me according to your word." Mary is wise because she accepts God's will. She is the greatest of all the saints because she is closest to her divine son and wants nothing more than to draw us close to Him.

In this new year, do your best to imitate Mary by drawing closer to her divine son, Jesus.

I belong to _____?

Can you belong to two parishes at the same time? Yes, you can. The obvious example would be all our winter visitors who are here for the winter months and "up north" during the summer.

Another example would be where a person has a property or a home here and a more permanent home elsewhere. You obviously can register in both parishes.

But if you only live in one area, can you belong to two parishes in that area?

It depends on what you mean by belonging!! If "belonging" only means going to Mass, then you can.

But being a genuine parishioner means a lot more than going to Mass. It does mean that but more so you are a vital part of the mission of the parish. You place your "tithe" there. You support the ministries—the mission of that parish. You are a vital part of that community.

Commitment is the key.

Stewardship Saint for January

Saint John the Almsgiver

Saint John the Almsgiver earned the title "almsgiver" because of his passion for social justice and his stewardship of the poor and oppressed. Born at Amathus, Cyprus, around 560, the son of the governor of Cyprus, he was wealthy and of noble lineage. His wife and children died before John reached the age of 50.

A devout Christian, John sought to live a life of simplicity and in the spirit of poverty despite his wealth. He used his riches and position to help the poor. Despite being a layman, the Church at Alexandria petitioned to have John appointed bishop. He was consecrated Patriarch of Alexandria in 610.

He pledged himself to practice "charity without limits" and placed several thousand needy persons under his personal, pastoral care. He always referred to the poor as his "lords and masters," because of what he called "their mighty influence at the Court of the Most High."


He divided the church treasury's gold among hospitals and monasteries, and worked to establish an economic redistribution system whereby poor people received adequate money and means to support themselves. Refugees from neighboring territories were welcomed with open arms.

John was a reformer who established new hospitals and increased the number of churches in Alexandria from seven to seventy.

As bishop, John developed a reputation for kindness. Twice weekly, he made himself available to anyone, rich or destitute, who wished to speak with him. People lined up and waited patiently for their turn.

When asked about his passionate concern for the poor, it is said that John often recounted a youthful dream. In it, a beautiful young woman told him that she was "charity." She told him: "I am the oldest daughter of the King. If you are devoted to me, I will lead you to Jesus. No one is as influential with him as I am. Remember, it was for me that he became a baby to redeem the world." John used this story to persuade the rich to be generous.

When the Persians sacked Jerusalem in 614, John sent food and money to support the Christian refugees. Eventually, the Persians took over Alexandria, and John himself was forced to flee to his native Cyprus. John died peacefully on November 11, 619. His feast day is January 23.






