

In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah we get a glimpse of a model for Christian stewards to follow. Within the temple, God's voice shakes the foundations and causes the natural world to shake and tremble. The Lord asks: "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" Isaiah replies to the call of God for service with immediacy and enthusiasm: "Here I am, send me!" There is no hesitation. There are no excuses, contingencies, or "what-ifs." Good stewards know that responding to the Lord's call to serve is never easy, never simple to grasp, never designed for ready comfort and success. But the call needs a response. What about us? What does it take to shake us into an enthusiastic response? To say to God: "Here I am, Lord. Send me!"

Our readings today remind us of the great privilege we have in calling ourselves both children and disciples of the Most High God.

The First Reading from Isaiah describes a vision of the prophet in which angels surround the Lord proclaiming, "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!" Our God invites us to such deep intimacy and friendship with Him that sometimes we can forget just how majestic and unspeakably holy He truly is.

In the Gospel passage, from Luke, Jesus instructs Simon to lower his nets for a catch despite an unsuccessful night of fishing. Peter is skeptical but obeys and is amazed at the catch of fish that he makes. He kneels down before Jesus in astonishment.

This sense of awe and reverence before God should motivate us to deepen our stewardship way of life. As we contemplate the holiness of God, we come to a heightened awareness of what a privilege it is that He has chosen to include us in His work of spreading the Gospel to others through the grateful sharing of the gifts He has given us. Aware of this privilege, we will then make the words of Isaiah our own: "Here I am Lord, send me!"



### **Our Catholic Appeal**

The 2025 OCA (Our Catholic Appeal) will begin February 15-16. The diocesan goal is \$17.7 million. Our parish share is \$184, 191.

If you have previously donated or pledged to OCA then you already received a request from our diocese to renew your annual OCA commitment. You know your finances. You are encouraged to add to your annual commitment if possible.

Our parish is deeply encouraged and thankful for your help as we strive to meet our commitment to our good diocese. If you are new or have never pledged to OCA before, please seriously consider doing so this year. Know that it is part of our moral commitment, following our baptism, to take part in the expense of spreading the full gospel which we, as Catholics, believe in.

You should, and you will, feel good to contribute your fare share. Because of the cooperation of our parishioners we are able to meet our responsibilities to our diocese. If we go over our goal, the parish retains 2/3 of that surplus while 1/3 goes to the care of sick and retired priests.

### **Capital Punishment**

The execution of James Ford was recently singed by Governor DeSantis. It is scheduled for 6pm on Thursday, February 13, 2025.

The Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops have appealed to the Governor to stay the execution and instead to commute his sentence to life without parole.

Mr. Ford's crime was the heinous murders of Gregory Mulnory and his wife Kimberly. The state has the responsibility of safeguarding the public from such people as James Ford. This can easily be done by a lifetime in prison without parole. This is still a most sincere punishment.

Commuting Mr. Ford's sentence enables the State of Florida to serve the requirements of justice without vengeance.

It also serves to protect the dignity and unalienable rights of every human being—that these rights are still protected because Mr. Ford deserves to be treated with human dignity.

It costs much less for life imprisonment then for the execution of a criminal.

And life imprisonment has the added value to the society of permitting the repentance and conversion on the part of the guilty.

Capital punishment has been abandoned by most all civilized countries of the world.

At Blessed Trinity we will have a special holy hour of adoration before the blessed sacrament in the main church on Tuesday, February 11th at 6:00pm.
