He also tells them that the Holy Spirit will be among them to teach them and remind them of all that Jesus had taught. Good stewards recognize that God is in their midst and that the Holy Spirit is guiding them. How often do we acknowledge God’s presence in our lives? How often do we allow the Holy Spirit to guide us?

The concept of hospitality is fundamental to a stewardship way of life. When we envision hospitality, we naturally think of offering a sincere and warm welcome — to those new to our parish, for instance. We picture inviting them in and making them feel at home and at ease in our presence, communicating to them that they are highly valued.

Today’s Gospel reading from John invites us to think of hospitality in a slightly different way. In it, we hear Jesus speaking this to his disciples: “Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him.”

Jesus is asking that we permit the Blessed Trinity to come and dwell within us. This is a stunning request. It tells us that our first and most privileged form of hospitality should be directed towards God Himself.

How does one show hospitality to God? How do we make God “at home and at ease” within us? How can we communicate to God that He is “highly valued” by us? Jesus tells us how: we are to keep His word, to follow His teachings.

To keep His word, we must know His word. This takes discipline and effort on our part. We must make the study of Scripture and Church teaching a priority in our daily lives.

If we want our parish to be a place of genuine Christian hospitality, we must be sure that our own hearts are hospitable dwelling places for the Blessed Trinity. Then our smiles and words, our greetings and ministries will radiate with the warmth of God’s love. And our parish family will become at least a little bit like Heaven on earth. This is the simplicity and glory of a stewardship way of life.



Graduations

Our local three Catholic schools have had graduations already or are scheduled.

Angels in Arms: 90 graduates on May 16th in Blessed Trinity church. Congratulations to all of you now qualified to enter the “big” school for kindergarten.

Blessed Trinity grade school: We have 85 8th graders ready to move on to the 9th grade at TCHS or one of the local public high schools. Their Baccalaureate Mass with the whole school is on May 22nd at 8:15am. Their graduation Mass is on May 27th at 6:30pm. You have been at “the top.” Don’t feel like you are now at “the bottom.” Have the great courage to follow your faith, be a leader, don’t blend in, stand out, be a big positive influence on your peers.

Trinity Catholic high school: We have 131 12th grade students ready to celebrate at least 13 years of success in the classroom. Their Baccalaureate Mass, with Bishop John Noonan as the principal celebrant, is at Blessed Trinity church on May 20th at 6:30pm. Their graduation ceremony is at the football stadium on May 23rd at 6:30pm. Most of you will go on to college or university. We include all of you in our prayers. Again—don’t blend in. Stand out. Keep God first in all your plans and decisions. Have a strong vibrant daily prayer life. If you do, you will be 100% successful. The Lord goes with you.
