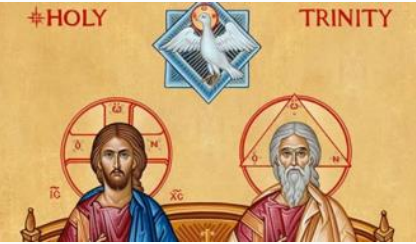
Today we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. What we are commemorating is a central reality of our Christian faith, that God is Trinitarian in nature — three distinct persons in one God.

The Church calls this truth a mystery, as indeed it is. Some have said that “mystery” in this context is “not a wall to run up against but an ocean in which to swim.” Contemplating the “ocean depths” of this mystery can make us humans feel so small, and almighty God so far from us. Yet nothing could be further from the truth as today’s readings demonstrate.

In the second reading, St. Paul reminds us that God is intimately connected to us. “The love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.” God wants live in the very depths of our being and in all the intimate details of our lives if we will let Him.

And in the Gospel from St. John, we learn that God holds back nothing of Himself from us. Jesus tells His disciples (this includes us!) that the Holy Spirit “will take from what is mine and declare it to you. Everything the Father has is mine.” Thus, we find ourselves drawn right into the midst of this Trinitarian love. In fact, if the mystery of Holy Trinity is an ocean which to swim, the “water” that makes up that ocean is love.

What then should be the response of the Christian steward to this sublime mystery? All we can do is worship. And offer our lives back to God in total gratitude for calling us to live in the richness of such unfathomable love.

### June Uganda Mission Trip

Seventeen people, including Sr. Juliet and Fr. Pat, will set out for Uganda this Sunday, June 15th. They will be at our sister parish for two weeks. A few of the ladies will stay for a month helping Fr. Charles with all the extra office work caused by the visiting pilgrims.

The group, over the two weeks, will meet the leaders of 33 villages; visit their churches and schools; listen to all their needs and try to respond to them; visit the orphanage with its 70+ orphans and discuss their needs; visit four trade schools and at least two graduations; visit our two medical and dental clinics and discuss their needs and meet over 100 individuals who will privately meet with Fr. Charles and Fr. Pat bringing their immediate urgent personal or family needs—such as: a medical bill, buy a wheelchair, a school book, a tuition bill, etc.

The group will return on June 29 except Fr. Pat. He will go to his family in Ireland for four weeks unless they send him back earlier!!



### Praying the Stations

The recent issue of The Triangle has the Statue of Jesus on the front cover. Jesus is overlooking our whole campus.

It is also an invitation to all of us.

The weather in Florida is very welcoming. We all need fresh air—How about “killing two birds with one stone?” Use the fresh air in the early hours of the day or late afternoon hours to improve your physical and mental health and , at the same time, pray the outdoor stations of the cross in our very uplifting outdoor prayer garden.

You could do that by:

- 1) Going there on your own and doing your own mediation at each station.
- 2) Going there with your spouse or friend and praying each station with the use of a station mediation booklet.
- 3) Go with your family or a group. Bring a mediation booklet. Let the mediation at each station be read by a different child or person. Conclude each meditation by saying one Our Father, one Hail Mary and one Glory Be.

It can be a great private meditation walk or a group meditation walk. If you do it as a family it will leave lasting, meaningful, spiritual memories with your child (ren) for life.

Small scale coffee, tea, cocoa and olive oil farmers are often squeezed onto the sidelines by large enterprises that can produce items faster, cheaper and in large quantities. **Fair Trade** helps these farmers maintain their livelihood by ensuring they are fairly compensated for their work and by supporting the creation of producer cooperatives to compete more effectively and bring social, cultural and economic benefits to entire communities. Most products are organic. This means the farmers preserve local river quality, improves the soil and prevents erosion, and farms without the use of toxic pesticides. We are selling **Fair Trade** coffee, tea, cocoa and olive oil this weekend after Mass.

### WANTED: Positive Male Role Models

Father's Day reminds us that fathers are a tremendous source of love, strength and protection for a child. Notwithstanding the faithful and heroic efforts of single moms bringing up children in today's society, children still need to be around Christian men who are positive role models; men who are actively involved in their life of faith, possess spiritual passion, and are faithful fathers and husbands.

Undoubtedly, parishes need more men to be involved in the spiritual development of young people.

Males bring a unique contribution that cannot be successfully substituted by females. Only men can serve as male role models and communicate the model of God as a loving father to children.

In today's society, for a number of reasons, many children grow up in single-parent homes, nurtured by their mothers. The parish or school may be the only place where these children have an opportunity to interact with men who model the loving, caring, and nurturing values of Christian manhood. Children can benefit from having a positive and responsible male role model in their lives.

It is said of young males that they are naturally more attentive to men when being taught good manners and respect for others. Men are generally better able to get young males unhooked from video games and involved in athletic competitions and outdoor activities so they can experience a wider world, and do things that are physically demanding; thus realizing a host of virtues. Adolescent males appear to develop emotional literacy, social skills, and Christian values more readily from men. And the presence of a Christian man helps reduce the possibility of a young male becoming disaffected, socially isolated, and more prone to embracing at-risk behaviors.



Of course, much of the above can be said for the importance of men in the lives of young women as well. But men can offer a unique Christian witness to young women in a culture that is so focused on young females as sex objects. It is important for girls to experience positive male role models; Christian men who see young women as children of God and are interested in what they say, think and feel as they grow in their spiritual lives.

Young people need both male and female role models. But adult males are fewer to be found. Let Father's Day remind us to find ways to connect with fathers and invite other positive male role models into the faith formation of our young people. Let's encourage men to get more involved in the parish as mentors, tutors, catechists and other ministries. Let's help young people see first-hand how Christian men follow Jesus Christ and live as His disciples in today's world.

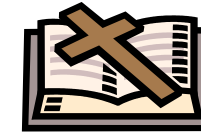
