Today's readings show us that it is not enough to be Christ's disciples in name only. To be a real disciple, we must live for Christ every day and in every aspect of life. This kind of life takes strength and discipline.

Intentionally and consistently offering the Lord the best of our Time, Talent, and Treasure through a stewardship way of life is a form of spiritual discipline. These spiritual disciplines teach us to become ever more aware of God's constant provision for us and they keep us on the narrow path towards the Kingdom of Heaven. The more we embrace this way of life, the more we can be "trained" by the Lord in the ways of true discipleship. Though difficult, these disciplines become a source of spiritual strength.

Our Lord Himself speaks of the difficult path to the Kingdom of Heaven in today's Gospel passage from Luke. He is asked, "Lord, will only a few be saved?" Jesus responds, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." Showing up for Mass on Sunday while living as if Christ is an afterthought the rest of the week does not make us disciples. What's more, this approach to our faith is an unjust and unloving response to our good God

who has given us all that we have and are.

Jesus does not want us to merely go through the motions of faith. He wants much more from us and for us. He wants to know us deeply and for us to get to know Him so that we become His holy disciples. This is not a burden; it is a privilege. But it does take discipline, the discipline of a stewardship way of life.



Adult Catholic Inquiry Class

The weekly inquiry class begins at 6:30pm on Wednesday, September 3rd in the chapel (cry room) in church at Blessed Trinity.

Any adult (18 & over) can attend. It is for Catholics who need a fresh look at our Catholic faith; for adults who are baptized Catholics but never received confirmation (or 1st communion); for interested adults who are looking into becoming Catholic or who have spouses who are Catholic and they want to learn more about the Catholic faith.

The course is free. You will receive two readable books on the teachings of our faith. You do not need to register in advance. Just come and sign in and check your name off each week.

School Tours In Uganda

Most all of our Catholic schools we have built in 22 villages in our sister parish are in the "bush." Apart from school and church, the families have no means to go beyond that—no transportation, etc.—except when we come once a year when they are exposed to a world beyond their village.

When I was on my annual tour of the village churches and schools this year I quickly realized there was something new a foot. Word had spread from one school to another that an annual school tour might be possible. Each of the 22 schools included in their list of requests, a budget for a school tour for P6 & P7 students. The cost varied from \$1,900 to \$2,200 per tour. The money would pay the bus and driver, two meals for approximately 75 students and a few teachers and would allow them to visit the River Nile, go to the zoo, and visit Entebbe Airport, etc.

I told them I would present their request to our people at Blessed Trinity Ocala, and Christ the King but I could not favor one school above another. If you would like to sponsor a school tour for these students in the bush, for \$2,000, it will be a thrill of a life time for them. If you want to name the school that is fine. We will see what results we get and then decide when we can go ahead and fulfill their school tour requests.
