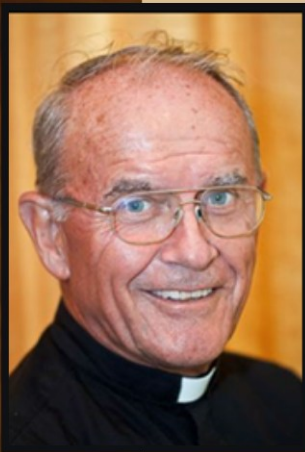

Adoration



For 33 years Blessed Trinity Parish has had the great blessing of having the Blessed Sacrament exposed 24 hours a day in a chapel specially designed for that purpose.

Over the years we have invited special guest homilists to speak on the blessings of our 24-hour adoration chapel. Fr. Martin Lucia was the first such homilist. Sign up sheets in the pews enabled us to get about 400 committed weekly adorers.

In the U.S. about 20%+ people move every year. So, we are always looking for new adorers. We need to replace the people who are moving away. We need to replace all the adorers each year who pass on from this life. But, more so, we need to keep on encouraging all our parishioners and friends to make at least a weekly visit before the exposed Blessed Sacrament in our chapel. Numerous people drop in for a visit each day – people who do not have a committed hour each week. It is our prayer and our hope that they will be inspired to select a fixed hour each week for adoration.

At present, we have 247 committed adorers. And we have 67 substitutes who can be called to fill in an hour when the regular adorer is on vacation or on the sick list. For many years our adoration chapel was left unlocked day and night. Whenever had any real serious trouble leaving it open. But because a few began to sleep there overnight, we put a combination lock on the door. Anyone who sincerely wants to make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament can easily get the code to access the adoration chapel.

We have been truly blessed over the years to get very dedicated directors to run this ministry. Presently Carol Blackstock (352-622-7348) is our coordinator and has been doing a fantastic job for 11 years. Karen Taylor (RIP) effectively ran this ministry for about 10 years and spent many, many hours weekly before the Blessed Sacrament. Each director tries to have 3 or 4 assistant directors. If the Holy Spirit inspires you to consider helping out, I know Carol Blackstock would love to talk to you.

All BT classes, from K to 8th grade, spend up to ten minutes as quietly as a class can before the Blessed Sacrament a few times a month. They are growing in their love for Jesus and getting used to spending quiet time with Jesus (without their gadgets).

If you are a parent, consider making a quiet visit with Jesus in the adoration chapel. Just drop in with your entire family at a time that suits your family. You will be leaving your children lasting, beautiful, sacred memories that will have a profoundly good effect on their futures.

A Franciscan priest, Fr. David Wathen OFM, is coming on the weekend of January 10/11 to preach the homily with special emphasis on adoration. Do your best to get inspired by Fr. David on that weekend. Spread the word. We will try to have new sign-up sheets for a weekly hour in adoration. Our goal always has been to get two committed adorers every hour of the 24-hour day.

CORRESPONSABILIDAD - STEWARDSHIP



My name is Fernando, and I am here with my wife Luz Myriam. Stewardship is defined in the Holy Scriptures in 1 Peter 4:10: "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace."

There is a lot written in the Bible regarding the use of our talents. This is a 24/7 job, but God also expects it, and it comes with many blessings!

My name is Bessy Ortiz and I have been part of this Blessed Trinity community for 6 years. When I first came to Blessed Trinity and heard about Stewardship my first question was, what is that? In Spanish, it's called Corresponsabilidad, but even then, I didn't quite understand it until much later.

My heart had been devastated by personal problems; I had to move to this country to live with my daughter. I felt the need to talk to a priest, and one day, after leaving the 11 a.m. Mass, Father Raúl was talking to Father Pat. I scheduled an appointment with him, and we talked a lot.

He introduced me to the person in charge of the Emmaus group and invited me to that Thursday's Mass and Rosary. I was also introduced to the leader of the Prayer group. That was my first day in that wonderful group, and they welcomed me with great joy. What caught my attention the most was seeing how they served and sang with so much happiness. When I finally attended the Emmaus retreat, I saw a light in my life, and it was JESUS. After a year-long pandemic and my personal issues, I felt transformed.

I wanted to serve in everything! I felt a call from God! He took care of placing me first as a lector, and after a while, I accepted the responsibility of taking charge of the Lectors Ministry with the blessing of Father Zbigniew. I have served in this ministry for more than 4 years! When Sister Magalis asked me for help with the Thursday choir, I joined that ministry. I also participate in the Heart of Mary Choir on the fourth Sunday of each month. God has allowed me to serve with the gifts He gave me that I had kept hidden. STEWARDSHIP OF TIME

My name is Mike Starling and I am the Dean of Students here at Blessed Trinity Catholic School. This is year 20 here at Blessed Trinity. Despite working here for as long as I have, our family just converted to Catholicism this past year. Quite simply, it was the best decision that our family has ever made. We are truly and completely at home at Blessed Trinity.

For 20 years, I have attended school and weekend masses, graduations, weddings and funerals at Blessed Trinity. I remained on the outside looking in and I thought Stewardship didn't completely apply to me. I methodically and intentionally picked the parts that were convenient. Perhaps others do the same. For me, the treasure part was a little more difficult, but I recognized that I could give my time.

In my capacity as teacher, administrator, and the school's athletic director for 19 years, I spent many hours here on campus, often arriving around 6:30 a.m. and staying until 9 or 10:00 at night. I thought, "that's a lot of time that I've given and that's enough". While accurate, it wasn't truly giving because it didn't come from my heart. In fact, for a very long time, I resented being on campus as much as I was.

However, through continual prayer before and during our family's conversion process, I realized that I didn't need to be here less. God was calling me to be here more! In the past year and a half or so, I've found that being here for school days or school related events have reinvigorated me, having found a newfound purpose to truly teach as a vocation and as our school's mission statement says,



"to inspire a lifelong pursuit of learning and living the Catholic faith."

Now, not only do I no longer resent being here, but I miss it when I'm not. Giving of my time and talents is no longer a resentment but rather, a true blessing.

My name is John Garri and this is my wife Robbi. We have been members of Blessed Trinity since 1989. The Sunday when we first heard of the Stewardship Way of Life, I think we were like so many of our peers - comfortable with giving a token amount each week. ABOUT ME

FR. WILLIAM BURNS

When I was asked to write a Triangle article introducing myself to the parish, the first thing that came to mind was the letter that our bishop, the Most Reverend John Noonan, wrote to introduce me to all of you. Since my journey was a bit long and winding, I would like to begin by sharing some of his words . . .

Father Burns moved from Massachusetts to Wildwood, Florida with his parents when he was eight years old. Feeling a calling to the priesthood but unsure of which path to take, he received a bachelor's degree in Religious Studies and English from Saint Leo College. He imagined he would serve the Church as a layperson. Then he pursued and earned a Master of Theological Studies at Weston Jesuit School of Theology in Cambridge, Massachusetts, now part of Boston College.

Missing home, he returned to Florida and worked at St. Timothy Catholic Church, Lady Lake in 1996 as Director of Adult Education. In 1998, he married and had his daughter, Sarah Rose, two years later. Eventually, the couple parted, and the marriage was annulled.

When he worked at Trinity Catholic High School, Ocala, several clergy and religious invited him to consider a vocation to the priesthood. He was surprised by the suggestion as he had been married and had a child but felt he had time to discern as he had to wait until Sarah Rose was old enough and secure in college. Ultimately deciding to pursue a vocation to the priesthood, his daughter, Sarah Rose, supported his decision.

As I was completing my four years of seminary at Pope St. John XXIII National Seminary in Weston, Massachusetts, Bishop Noonan

informed me of his decision to assign me to Blessed Trinity. I was both extremely delighted and surprised. How beautiful it is for me to return to the region of our diocese that I have always called home and to enter priestly ministry under a true mentor, Fr. Pat Sheedy.

Following my Ordination on May 24th, I began my assignment as a Parochial Vicar of Blessed Trinity on June 6th. That first weekend at Blessed Trinity was very moving. After every Mass, people would come up to me and say something to the effect of, "You don't know us, but you taught our child at Trinity Catholic", or former students – now in their late 20s or early 30s – would introduce me to their children. It was so heartwarming to see familiar faces and to be welcomed by new ones. I have been struck by the vibrancy of this parish, its multigenerational involvement, and its self-giving. I must say, it is quite a blessing to celebrate a school Mass and look out to see 700 children!

Prior to seminary, I had spent 23 years as a professional in parish and school ministry. However, priestly ministry is new to me. Our community has been very kind and patient as I have been learning the practice of being a priest. I ask everyone to continue having patience with me as I grow in my priestly identity and grow in my understanding of our parish. Please accept my gratitude to all of you for your support and encouragement. Please know that I am grateful to Fr. Pat, Fr. Zbigniew, and our staff who have been so good to me. Most of all, please keep me in your prayers, as I will be keeping all of you in mine. As I recently told Bishop Noonan, "There's nowhere else I'd rather be".

La Guadalupana's 25th Anniversary:

*A Legacy of Faith, Service, and
Community in Ocala*



Nestled in the heart of Ocala, La Guadalupana stands as a beacon of faith, compassion, and community service. The mission's history traces back to 1996 when some mainly Mexican families in the Ocala Estates area (known as Little Mexico) would gather weekly to pray the Rosary, and what began as a small dream on a three-acre plot of land has grown into a thriving mission dedicated to spiritual growth, education and outreach to those most in need.

To the generosity of vision of architect Nicolás Mansito, who designed the building; builder Miguel Ferrer; and the committed contribution of the community with the project, donating labor, clearing land, etc; made the construction of the church possible. Their contribution laid the foundation, both literally and spiritually, for what would become one of Ocala's most active and welcoming mission churches.

When the mission first opened its doors in 2001, it sat on three acres of land, a humble beginning for what would soon blossom into a vibrant hub of ministry. In 2007 with the generosity of Mr. Bill Del Zotto – owner of Del Zotto Concrete - a house was built to house the Hermanas Catequistas Misioneras (Missionary Catechist Sisters) who arrived in 2007.

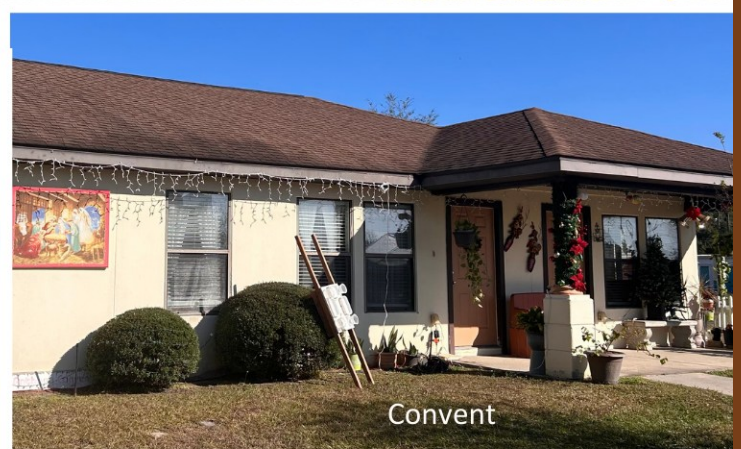
Early on, parish leaders saw a need to support local families and children, and in an extraordinary act of collaboration and goodwill, they reached out to a local Day Care enter. A special lease was created, offering the use of the space for just \$1 per

year, and the RCMA La Guadalupe Child Development Center opened its doors in 2016. The partnership has since helped nurture and educate countless children in a safe and faith-filled environment for the little ones.

As the community expanded, so did the mission's outreach. With faith and foresight, the parish purchased an additional five acres, allowing room for ministries and projects that would further serve the people of Ocala and beyond. One of the most significant accomplishments born from this growth was the establishment of a Clinic for the uninsured and low-income families, developed in partnership with Catholic

Charities. In 2016 this vital facility started providing compassionate care and medical assistance to those who might otherwise go without, embodying the mission's Gospel call to serve "the least of these".

From this sacred space, several ministries now thrive, ranging from faith formation and youth programs to food distribution, family support, ministries for the sick and homebound, and community outreach initiatives. Each ministry reflects the spirit of Our Lady of Guadalupe, bringing hope, love, and faith to everyone who walks through the mission's doors.

As the mission continues to grow, new challenges arise. In today's world, ensuring the safety of parishioners and children is of primer importance. For this reason, a security gate at the entrance was installed this November. In the upcoming months a new \$1 million plus building will be erected to accommodate the ever-growing religious education classes for children, youth, young people and adults.

From its humble beginnings to its present-day role as a cornerstone of faith and service in Ocala, La Guadalupe Catholic Mission joyfully celebrates its 25th anniversary, giving thanks to God for a quarter century of faith, service, and community. With gratitude for the past and hope for the future, we honor all who have helped this mission grow and continue to shine Christ's light guided by love, generosity, and the intercession of Our Blessed Mother.

My name is Gladys Moscote. Stewardship may be new to you but it was practiced by the first Christians who lived during the time of Jesus. When my daughter was in Kindergarten, I had the opportunity to participate in the Carnival, and year after year I came to understand what it meant to give of my time, my talent, and my treasure for the good of the community. Despite not being fluent in English, I always had people around me who helped me and made me feel useful. I was part of the Welcome Committee for parents who only spoke Spanish to explain to them what Christian Stewardship was.

I was a chaperone on school trips and helped for many years selling ice cream in the cafeteria. I continued collaborating with Carnivals until 2012. That year, I was diagnosed with a cancerous tumor in my head. I had to undergo 7 ½ hours of surgery to remove most of it. I still have 30% that could not be removed. After my surgery, and having no family to take care of my children, it was my Christian family—the parents and classmates of my children—who took care of taking them to school and their day to day activities. I am extremely grateful to the Blessed Trinity community, the parents, the students, and Father Pat.

After I recovered, I was unable to work. I continued selling ice cream from Monday to Friday and joined the Covenant Mission Team ministry.

Many people ask me why I continue to serve the church even though my children have already graduated from university, as if Christian responsibility had an expiration date! I serve the Lord in gratitude for my husband, for my children, for my health, for the angels He has sent me in my difficult situations because CHRIST is the most important thing for me; that is why I live the lifestyle of a responsible Christian.

Hi. I'm Judy Vokes. I buried my husband here 8 years ago. And I'm here to tell you why I support the Stewardship Way of Life.

I've always believed in giving back. This has meant setting aside monies for charities, teaching CCD, serving on multiple boards, including local charities and the President of the School Board of the best Catholic high school in NH.

When we moved to Ocala, we tried the closest Catholic Church, but it didn't meet our needs. I'm working on giving my treasure but haven't quite made it to tithing. Please, join me in the Stewardship Way of Life. It's a very positive way of living in a very negative world.



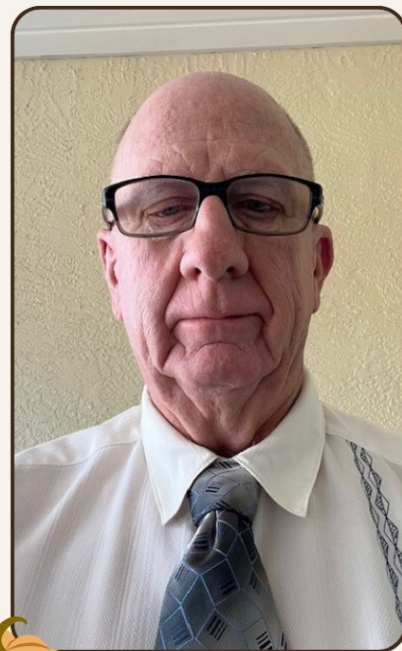

I am Glen Fiorello and I believe there are no coincidences with the Good Lord.

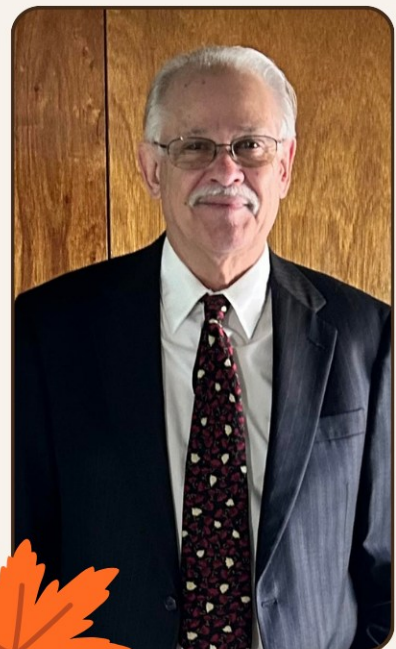
